Students 16 to 17 years old on the date of the election may serve as a Student Election Judge. You will be paid for your time, same as regular Election Judges. Being a part of the election process is an exciting process for high school students to gain valuable experience and help your community at the same time. Students age 18 years or older may serve as a regular Election Judge.

- Be at least 16 years old on the date of the election
- Be a citizen of the United States (identification may be required)
- Be a resident of Dodge County
- Be able to read, write, and speak the English language
- Be enrolled in high school or be home-schooled
- Have parent and school principal approval
- Attend Election Judge Training with Dodge County Elections (2 hrs)

You cannot be:

- Related to another Election Judge in the same precinct and work at the same time
- A candidate's child, step-child, sibling, step-sibling, or live in the same household as a candidate on the ballot

Schools may offer extra credit in some courses for students who serve as Student Election Judge Trainees.
